Minutes approved from October 17, 2018

- **Report on Parking and Transportation - Mike Manzella**
- PARKING ENFORCEMENT - The City will be changing the way they do parking enforcement. There will no longer be decals, instead cars will be identified through their license plates. The benefits to the public is that they will not have to re-pay for a spot if they move their car. Whatever amount of time they paid for it will remain with the car until the time expires. This new system eliminates the need for numbered spots.
- To help facilitate this new system there will be new meters with both letters and numbers so that people can punch in their license plate number. People can register and make changes online.
- They will have separate zones with different rates. Employers will receive 1 employee permit. 15 minute spots will remain in tact.
- DLD - Deal Lake Drive will be re-paved by the end of 2018.

- The DOT will replace sidewalks, and pave streets. The City will install trees, benches, and bus shelters.
- **CAR SHARE PROGRAM** - The electric vehicle car share program will be in place in February or March of 2019. There will be charging stations installed throughout the City.
- **BIKE SHARE** - The bike share contract will be up for renewal next summer. The City is looking into other companies. This past year there were 5,000 bike share users and 3,000 just in the summer. Asbury Park is the only town in the area that has implemented a Bike Share program.
- **PARKLET** - The City will be getting another parklet through a grant. The cost to make the new parklet was approx 10,000.-12,000. The new one will have wheels and be mobile.
- **Committee Information Session to be held on Thursday 11/29 at 7 pm.** At the Springwood Ave. Senior Center. The purpose of the meeting is to let people know “what we do” - that anyone can come to a meeting and where the minutes can be found. There will be encouragement to invite people to apply if there are open spots on any Committees, Commissions, and Boards. Sonia has asked for the committee to help spread the word.
- **Open Street Events** - On May 4th 2019 from 1-5 pm the City is sponsoring AP Alive. Part of the days festivities will include Art, music, food, culture. As well as vendors, sponsors, and healthy food.
